MINI LESSON

Every person in the world is special — and that includes you! Social studies starts right here, with the most important topic of all: who you are.

Your identity

- Your name is your own special label — no one else in the world is exactly like you.
- You have an age that tells how many years you have been alive.
- You are in Grade 1 — that is the level of school you are studying.

Your family

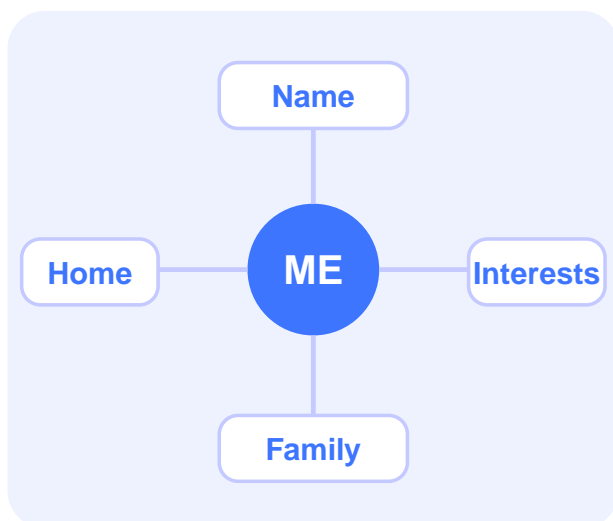
- Your family is the group of people who love and care for you at home.
- Families come in all shapes and sizes — big, small, and everything in between.

Your home

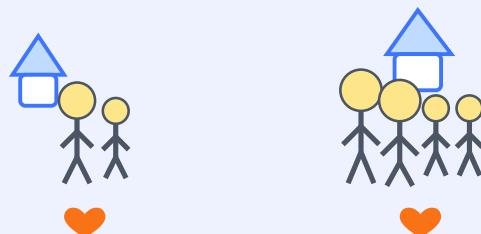
- You live in a city or town — a place where many families live together.
- Your city is part of a bigger place called a community.

What makes you unique

- Your interests are the things you love to do — drawing, running, reading, building.
- No two people have exactly the same combination of name, family, home, and interests.



All families are different



Small or big — every family is loved.

VOCABULARY

Identity All the things that make you who you are
e.g. My name and family are part of my identity.

Unique Different from everyone else, one of a kind
e.g. Every person is unique.

Community A group of people who live or work together
e.g. My city is part of a bigger community.

Family The people who love and care for you at home
e.g. My family eats dinner together.
